### Solución al ejercicio 3

#### **Mother of two killed in a hit-and-run accident**

Yesterday afternoon a mother of two died in a hit-and-run while walking near the Platte River. Ann Miller, 34, was with her niece when she was struck by a vehicle heading south. Witnesses describe the vehicle that fled the scene as a large grey SUV. One of the witnesses, a local resident, who said drivers often speed in the area, heard the impact and rushed out to see if it was one of his children who had been struck. When he got outside he saw the driver of the grey SUV get out of his car, look at the woman lying on the ground, get back in his car and take off. He sped away, leaving the hardworking mom dying on the pavement two and a half blocks from her home. Despite the efforts of emergency services, Ann died at the scene. Deputies are searching for the hit-and-run driver. Ann Miller's niece, Katie 12 was also hit and had to be taken to the hospital. She suffered two slipped discs, fractured vertebrae and a bruised hip. However, she is expected to be released later this week.

Doctors told Ann's family that despite her injuries, her lungs and kidneys were healthy enough to help four people. Her family has decided that they will donate all useable organs so that Ann can go on helping other people, because that's what she would have wanted. "Ann had such a good heart, she was always going out of her way to help others. It's so unfortunate that something so bad could happen to such a good person," said her sister Kayla, "Now her children will have to go on without a mother, it's just not fair." It's a lot harder for the family to grieve when they lost their loved one in such a terrible tragedy.

#### Breaking News:

Several weeks later, police located and arrested Dennis Anderson, who was accused of the hit and run against Ann Miller. On Friday he was sentenced to seven years in state prison, with 297 days of time served in the Lincoln County Jail, plus \$155 in fines and fees. On a careless-driving charge, Anderson was fined \$200 plus \$39 in fees. Anderson was also ordered to reimburse the state victims fund \$5,000 and pay the victim's family more than \$13,000 in funeral and burial costs. The application that was filed, on behalf of Anderson, to the state's early release Intensive Supervision Program was denied.
